3. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

Taxes (**15%** for foreign riders) and cost of health papers, electricity, water
Article 30.II of the 1990 Finance Law, revising article 182B of the CGI, imposes a 15 % deduction at source on payments made after January 1st 1990 to persons living outside of France for sporting events or artistic performances taking place in France, subject to the provisions of international conventions.

4. PAYMENTS

Payments for entries, stables, MCP or other costs are to be paid at the show secretary on Sunday after the last class the athlete has participated in. Prize money will be paid at the same time. Will be accepted as valid methods of payment : cash, Visa, Master card and American Express. (No cheques)

5. INSURANCES

All owners and Athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. The OC will NOT be responsible for any damage caused by competitors, their horses, owners, their employees/grooms or their representatives.

Accidents, illness, fires

The Committee assumes NO responsibility for accidents or illness that might occur affecting the owners, riders, grooms or horses, or for thefts, fires and other damages.

By making the definite entries each competitor declares that he/she has taken notice of the schedule and the exclusion of the liability as set out in the schedule and that the competitor explicitly agrees therewith.

6. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and **Athletes** must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
