## 3. HORSES / PONIES

Transport for the horses of the 25 best athletes of the Global Champions Tour Ranking 2009 established after the GCT Valkenswaard and for specific athletes appointed by the OC for maximum 2 horses per athlete will be organised at the expense of the Qatar Equestrian Federation only on flights designated by the Qatar Equestrian Federation. The athletes have to respect carefully the instructions and conditions of the air freight company appointed by the Qatar Equestrian Federation. Transport expenses to and from the airport in Europe are to be paid by the athlete. The Qatar Equestrian Federation takes care of the transport to and from Doha International Airport and the showgrounds.

**NB: Withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling, hotel expenses and horse transportation) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show. Furthermore these athletes can be excluded from other GCT events.**

The stables will be open from 7/11/2009 to 17/11/2009. If stabling is required outside this period please contact the OC.

## 4. WELCOME

**All persons travelling to Qatar need a international passport that has a validity of at least 6 months.**

After the prize giving ceremony of the GCT Final the 3 best riders have to go immediately to the Press Conference.**

Bridle according to Art. 260. On order of the OC the riders must immediately assemble for the prize giving ceremony. No prize money will be paid to a rider who does not take part in the prize giving ceremony and/or press conferences without being excused by the Ground Jury and the OC.

The owner of the winning horse is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix.

## 4. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outlined in the schedule. This includes government taxes. If it is necessary for OCs to deduct such taxes, they must provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted. All payments will be made according to applicable law and tax regulations. Competitors will be asked to provide all necessary information (Passport & Sofi-number), in order to guarantee a correct tax procedure.

## 5. INSURANCES

### 16. Stable Security

## THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

### FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and **Athletes** must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
